### Accomplishments

- Our Society has digitized The Tawas Herald and it is available to all everywhere at <u>https://www.ioscoarenaclibrary.org/HSGS/Tawas</u> <u>Herald 1884-1952/</u> on the Iosco Arenac District Library site. 1953-1981 has been sent to the digitizers.
- Our Society scanned the Ard G. Emery glass negative collection at the losco County Historical Museum. These glass negatives were the source for our book: *losco County: the Photography of Ard G. Emery, 1892-1904* published in 2015.

- Our Society has a growing collection of records for losco County as well as surrounding counties, and Canada.
- We have 1000+ indexes and over 1 million names to many local resources, most are available through our website.
